- Approval of June board minutes: Sid W moved for approval, 2nd by Annie M motion passes
- 2. Approval of Treasurer's end-of-June balance report. Diane M noted \$225 came in from members renewing w/o email consequent to Diane M's letter -- \$60 dues (4 memberships), \$170 donations Sid W moved for approval, 2nd by CJ G motion passes
- 3. Multi-chapter program suggestion presented by Cheryl Fallstead Nature journaling John Muir Laws has conducted workshops in conjunction with National Audubon. Idea is that our chapter + other chapters, El Paso Audubon each chapter chips in. Focus on SW birds, how to nature journal, why to nature journal. Intensive observation, inquiry method. Mark P suggested other eco groups in town Sierra Club, Native Plant Society, FOMDP, Elaine S suggested DA Arts Council board will look at website, poll will be conducted to see if members interested,
- 4. Updates from June meeting:

<u>T-Shirts</u>: the question was 50/50 or all cotton...the answer is it's our choice, and the cotton is pre-shrunk

Cheryl F has worked with him in person for Ukes and other things and says he is actually really good to work with, despite his lack of email communication -- she has his catalog for different types of shirts and has mixed/matched – he just wants total minimum # of shirts – short sleeve, long sleeve. CJ G and Annie M favor all cotton. Cheryl F says he will order sample. EAS will get catalog from Cheryl F.

My neighbor, McGonagle junior said that his dad might be able to help us out, and Aaron will be contacting McGonagle (senior) Insurance.

Along the same vein, all liability waivers for bird walks should be consistent and possibly vetted again--? The last thing I want is for the MVAS board to be sued because someone gets bit by a snake or falls into the river something on

a walk and says it's our fault for taking us to such dangerous locations. EAS requesting copy of liability waiver from Wayne.

Adopt a Spot: EASS took Adopt-A-Spot paperwork to Parks & Rec for James wood with letter re first choice and second choice. He replied via email on June 19 that he'd be back in touch after July 15, noting, "My program is still on hold and will not continue until the next phase of the reopening."

Membership: EASS and DM talked about Nat'l versus chapter. ES working on combining spreadsheets. Great opportunity to boost membership roster. Diane M says Aud reporting starts in September for her so that she can submit before end of November.

Zoom: We are signed up. EASS paid, sent receipt to Diane M June 29, received check following week. If automatically renews, so if we don't want it to renew, we need to cancel in June 2021 (plus the rate goes up \$30 because of this year's discount).

Meeting location: Sid and Elaine have started to call hotels for prices. Courtyard Marriott where we were quoted \$50/meeting for 10 months' of meetings. Kristi at WBU was not interested in hosting.
